Dear Sir,

We, the undersigned, acting for and in the behalf of the inhabitants of Curra-Creek, hereby beg to make application for a piece of land, not less than two acres, for church and burying ground purposes. Such land being situate on a reserve of crown lands, joining the conditional purchase of JOHN COSIER and JOHN PARKES, and having on the border line a tree marked (81) parish of Gordon, county of Catombil.

We beg to draw attention to the fact that the nearest burying ground is seventeen miles distant.

There are twenty four families living in the immediate neighbourhood, and this is the only land available for church purposes, in a central position.
